### Ch – Evergreen Tree

#### Answer the questions:

a. Did the bird fly to warm south when the cold days came? What did it do?

Ans. No, the bird didn't fly to the warm south when the cold weather came. She hopped from tree to tree seeking for food and shelter.

b. Who sent north wind to shake off the leaves?

Ans. Frost king sent north wind to shake off the leaves.

c. How did the spruce, pine and juniper tree help the bird?

Ans. Spruce tree gave the bird a shelter to live, pine tree protected it from the cold and strong wind all winter long and Juniper tree gave it berries all winter to eat.

d. Why wouldn't willow tree help the bird?

Ans. The willow tree would not help the bird because it did not like talking to strangers.

e. Why did frost king spare the leaves of the spruce, pine and juniper tree?

Ans. The frost king spared the leaves of spruce, pine and juniper because they had been kind to the little bird with broken wing.

#### Reference to context questions:

a. Who is the speaker?

Ans. The birch tree is the speaker.

b. Who is the stranger referred to?

Ans. The injured little bird who needed a place to stay for the winter.

c. What was the result of this refusal?

Ans. In the end, The Frost King ordered the North Wind to freeze the leaves of such selfish trees, causing them to lose their leaves in winter.

2. *"You may keep their leaves, but the others will lose theirs."*

a. Who said this and to whom?

Ans. The Frost King said this to the North Wind.

b. Who were the trees allowed to keep their leaves?

Ans. The Pine, Spruce, and Juniper trees, as they helped the little bird.

c. Why were the other trees punished?

Ans. They were selfish and refused to shelter the bird.
